Promote Award Info

The Promote Award is given to the Team that is most successful in creating a compelling video message for the public designed to change our culture and celebrate science, technology, engineering, and math. Teams must submit a oneminute-long public service announcement (PSA) video. The PSA for the 2023-2024 season is "The best thing about FIRST Tech Challenge is..."

Details on criteria and guidelines can be found on page 60/61 of the <u>FTC Game Manual, Part 1</u>. All teams are eligible for this award at Dakota FTC State Championship. Submissions are due at the time of your interview before state and we will share submission details after qualifiers. This does not count towards one of the larger awards, meaning you can get this in addition to others.

Compass Award Info

Your coach or mentor donates many hours to help your team be successful each year. <u>PLEASE</u> take the time to honor their work and consider a submission for this award.

The Compass Award recognizes an adult coach or mentor who has given outstanding guidance and support to a Team throughout the year and demonstrates to the Team what it means to be a Gracious Professional. The winner of the Compass Award will be chosen from candidates nominated by FIRST Tech Challenge Student Team members, via a 40-60 second video submission. The video must highlight how their mentor has helped them become an inspirational Team. We want to hear what sets the mentor apart. Details on criteria and guidelines can be found on page 61 of the <u>FTC Game Manual, Part 1</u>.

Submissions are due one week prior to state.
